Revised List of changes advised by the HSE and Bishop Tom for our Churches.

From Monday 6th September Churches can operate to 50% of capacity for all ceremonies, except in the case of marriages, the limit which remains 100 persons until October 22nd. In effect this means PODs and social distance regulations for churches no longer apply, the only restriction being 50% capacity. To ensure 50% capacity only, it is recommended that each seat have a maximum of 4 people except in the case of families. All ropes will now be removed from seats. ***Face masks must continue to be worn. Please continue to use hand sanitisers at church doors.***
